  - iv. Major Plant Designation Ms. Bonkowski explained that more than likely that the capacity of the plant would be rounded up by the IEPA when designating whether or not the plant is major or not. In example, .99 is 1, .95 is 1. She will continue to look into this.
  - v. Equipment Costs The budget in general was discussed An additional \$250,000 per year would be needed to cover the budget shortfall if sewer s services were no longer provided and the City retained the same number of employees.
  - vi. Employee Costs see note above. Staff will provide budget details to the Committee.

#### New Business:

  - i. Member round table: What does the Committee need to know to provide a recommendation to the City Council?
    - a. Mr. Stage said that he would like to know if the City can save the capital fee in order to help pay for the future expansion / connection to KWRD. Also provided feedback that he would like

- B. Discussion on deliverables from the June 1, 2022 meeting:
  - i. Why .5 MGD expansion? Ms. Bonkowski explained that the .5 MGD was likely pointing back to a Facility Plan that had been done in 2006, which estimated that the City would need a .47 MGD expansion to accommodate growth over the next 20 years (2006-2026). This of course changed after building halted in 2008. When the City approached Baxter and Woodman about a plant expansion, it seems the .47 needed in 2006 was rounded up to .5 MGD because that is a practical size for a package plant. Staff will revisit population projections over the next 20 years.
  - ii. Projected capacity over the next 10 years Ms. Melton presented information showing that the City could issue an additional 43 new home permits per year before being on the IEPA's restricted status due to growth. This does not accommodate for industrial or commercial growth. Under this item, the Commission also discussed at length the need to amend the City's ordinances to increase the fee for meter sizes and placing the revenue generated into capital in order to help pay for future capital costs of acquiring additional capacity. The Commission also discussed the creation of a industrial monitoring program.
  - iii. Budget details if no wastewater service is provided by the City Ms. Seguss reviewed a financial summary that demonstrated a budget shortfall of \$250,000 if the City were to not reduce Staff and have one less division to share costs of operational budget items such as internet, phones, auditing, and IT.

#### New Business:

- A. Discuss Wastewater Treatment Options
  - i. Member round table: During this time, Ms. Bonkowski reviewed information on how to reduce bottlenecking at the City's WWTP, which included adding an aeration tank(s) and a secondary clarifier. There will be

additional discussion about this at a future meeting. Ms. Bonkowski also reviewed the cost of the "Fluence" (trailer) package plant which is \$1.2 - \$1.6 million plus 30% - 40% of additional equipment and construction costs. Ms. Bonkowski also explained that package plants vary in size based on the communities need. Lastly, Ms. Bonkowski also explained that per the IEPA, and additional capacity added to the City's WWTP could require stricter effluent limits to be implemented.

#### Old Business:

- A. Ms. Wesner moved and Mr. Bradac seconded to approve the August 3, 2022 Special Wastewater Treatment Committee meeting. Upon voice vote, all members present voted yes.
- B. Discussion on deliverables from the August 3, 2022 meeting:
  - City/County population projections Ms. Seguss stated that the DeKalb County Economic Development Corporation provided population data for the City's previous Wastewater Treatment Plant study, however, DCEDC does not have current data.
  - ii. Feasibility and costs to reduce "bottlenecking" City Engineer Bonkowski provided email correspondence that the approximate cost of reducing the current "bottlenecking" occurring at the Wastewater Treatment Plant would be approximately \$2.1 million to add a \$900,000 secondary clarifier as well as two new aeration tanks, totaling \$1.2 million. This would create an additional 0.1 MGD of capacity. The Committee noted that the 0.1 MGD increase seems to be proportionate when considering costs when comparing to the larger .5 MGD projects previously proposed. The Committee discussed this option and would like to know what is the right amount of capacity (somewhere between 0.1 and 0.5, presently), however, this bottlenecking reduction could be an option in the future in a bind. The question then became how much capacity is needed. The Committee reviewed the data that showed each 0.1 MGD could serve 3 equivalents of Custom Aluminum / Polar Tech (industrial businesses).

#### New Business:

- A. Discuss KWRD ordinances and agreements:
  - i. Ordinance 601: The Committee discussed KWRD's Ordinance 601. The Committee likes the ordinance's rates and would like to amend the City's ordinances to model it. The Committee discussed the need to use increased fees to save for future expansion needs. When this change occurs, the Committee stated that there would need to be a campaign to inform residents and businesses what the increase is for.
  - ii. KWRD and Malta 2020 Agreement: The Committee discussed their concern with paragraph 4 of this document that requires Malta to get

approval for an expansion of the service area. The Committee would like to know more about what this process means. The Committee also discussed that they would like to see a "clawback" or a way to take back the sewer infrastructure if the City is unhappy with KWRD's service.

The Committee discussed the need to have a list of questions and requirements to regionalize in order to be most productive when KWRD attends a meeting. A date for KWRD to attend a Committee meeting will be determined in the future.

The Committee did not have sufficient time to review the other agreements and their review and discussion will be tabled until the next meeting.

# SPECIAL WASTEWATER TREATMENT COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

December 7, 2022

Nick Bradac called the December 7, 2022 City of Genoa Wastewater Treatment Committee Special Meeting to order at 6:05 PM.

On roll call, members Walter Stage and Nick Bradac were present; Member Pam Wesner joined at 6:10 PM; Mayor Jonathon Brust, Janice Melton, and Alyssa Seguss, City of Genoa; Mark Eddington and Mike Holland of the Kishwaukee Water Reclamation District were also present.

#### **Old Business:**

A. Mr. Bradac moved and Mr. Stage seconded to approve the October 19, 2022 Special Wastewater Treatment Committee meeting minutes. Upon voice vote, all members present voted aye.

#### **New Business:**

- A. Discuss Wastewater Treatment with the Kishwaukee Water Reclamation District
  - i. KWRD Staff gave an overview of the KWRD as a whole. KWRD explained that Genoa needs to decide what kind of development they are seeking over the next 15-20 years. If the same amount of development that occurred over the last 15 years is wanted, then no need for additional capacity. If Genoa is looking for significant growth, either an expansion or connection to the KWRD is needed for additional capacity. KWRD told the WTC to keep in mind that expanded the current plant would require a higher connection fee for new development to pay for the expansion (\$9,100 to pay for a .5MGD at a cost of \$13 million) than the KWRD requires.
  - ii. Next, KWRD and the Committee reviewed the list of requirements that the City would have in order to connect to the KWRD. A majority of the items were agreeable to both parties after discussion.
  - iii. The Committee and KWRD need to further discuss both representation on the KWRD board and capacity limitations that would trigger increased capacity of the forced main.
  - iv. The Committee discussed needing feedback from the Comprehensive Plan in order to move forward with discussions with KWRD.
